



FEBRUARY GUEST SPEAKER



Renee Ellmers

N.C. 2nd Congressional District Candidate

Renee Ellmers was born in Ironwood in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. When she was a child, her family moved to Madison Heights, near Detroit, where her father took a job in the auto industry. He worked with General Motors until he retired.

After graduating from Madison High School and needing to work her way through college, Renee trained as a Medical Assistant. For the next eight years, working full and part-time

jobs, she attended Oakland University, graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing.

A year later, working as a Surgical Intensive Care Nurse at Beaumont Hospital she met her husband, Brent, a graduate of the University Of Indiana School Of Medicine.

After their son was born and while visiting family in Cary, Renee and her husband decided to move to North Carolina. Today she works with her husband as Clinical Director of the Trinity Wound Care Center in Dunn.

Renee is active in community affairs, having served as Vice President of Community Development for the Chamber of Commerce and as President Elect of the Chamber for the coming year. She has also served on the Dunn Planning Board, the board of the Betsy Johnson Hospital Foundation and the Harnett County Nursing Home Committee.

She volunteers at Cape Fear Christian Academy where her son, Ben, is a student, and teaches Sunday school at Sacred Heart Catholic Church.

Last summer she and her husband attended a Town Hall meeting to hear Congressman Bob Etheridge speak on behalf of President Obama's health care plan. Later, as a volunteer, she became an outspoken critic of government-run health care. She is now a candidate for Congress – opposing Congressman Bob Etheridge – in North Carolina's 2nd District.

Massachusetts' new senator

As the new senator from Massachusetts, Senator-elect Scott Brown, said, "It's not the Ted Kennedy

seat. It's not the Democrat seat. It's the people's seat."

Instead of Ted, let's remember an honorable and courageous Republican senator who once filled the seat to which Scott Brown was elected. During the GOP's 1860 election campaign, Senator Sumner gave a speech that speaks to us today:

"If ever there was a moment when every faculty should be bent to the service, and all invigorated by an inspiring zeal, it is now, while the battle between Civilization and Barbarism is still undecided.

Happily, a political party is at hand whose purpose is to combine and direct all generous energies for the salvation of the country. The work must be done, and there is no other organization by which it can be done. A party with such an origin and such a necessity cannot be for a day, or for this election only.

If bad men conspire for slavery, good men must combine for freedom. And when this triumph is won, securing the immediate object of our organization, the Republican Party will not die, but, purified by long contest with slavery, and filled with higher life, it will be lifted to yet other efforts for the good of man.

Others may dwell on the past as secure; but to my mind, under the laws of a beneficent God, the future also is secure, on the single condition that we press forward in the work with heart and soul, forgetting self, turning from all temptations of the hour, and, intent only on the cause."

Senator Charles Sumner (R-MA) was one of the founders of the Republican Party. Angered by Sumner's denunciations of slavery, a Democrat congressman beat him nearly to death on the floor of the U.S. Senate. Sumner responded with a classic denunciation of the Democratic Party for promoting [The Barbarism of Slavery](#).

During the GOP's 1860 election campaign, Senator Sumner gave a speech that speaks to us today:

"If ever there was a moment when every faculty should be bent to the service, and all invigorated by an inspiring zeal, it is now, while the battle between Civilization and Barbarism is still undecided.

Happily, a political party is at hand whose purpose is to combine and direct all generous energies for the salvation of the country. The work must be done, and there is no other organization by which it can be done. A party with such an origin and such a necessity cannot be for a day, or for this election only.

If bad men conspire for slavery, good men must combine for freedom. And when this triumph is won, securing the immediate object of our organization, the Republican Party will not die, but, purified by long contest with slavery, and filled with higher life, it will be lifted to yet other efforts for the good of man.

Others may dwell on the past as secure; but to my mind, under the laws of a beneficent God, the future also is secure, on the single condition that we press forward in the work with heart and soul, forgetting self, turning from all temptations of the hour, and, intent only on the cause."

The day he died, Charles Sumner urged Republicans to stay true to the principles of our Grand Old Party: "My bill, the civil rights bill - don't let it fail." The Republican-controlled 43rd Congress honored his memory by passing the [1875 Civil Rights Act](#).

Have a Heart

February, shortest month of the year, is noteworthy for numerous holidays and other days of observance.

Valentine's Day tops the list with visions of hearts, roses, chocolates, love and friendship! Card companies say Valentine cards comprise 25 percent of those sent yearly. It's nice having one more opportunity to reflect on those we care about. We Republicans can take this opportunity to "spread some love around," choosing to be friendlier to members and potential members.

Presidents Day, an evolved title, is celebrated on the third Monday of February. This is a federal holiday for Washington's Birthday. Historically, we celebrated Washington's Birthday on 2/16 and Lincoln's birthday on 2/22, but Lincoln's birthday was never a federal holiday. In 1968, Congress created more uniform federal holidays by moving several to Mondays to create three-day weekends and Washington's Birthday was moved. This new date fell between the two presidential birthdays and the notion of celebrating both on this holiday became popular. Eventually, all presidents were included by some.

40 Days for Life, a growing pro-life movement, occurs from 2/17 through 3/28 this year.

National Director David Bereit states, "While many see a time of darkness -- as the U.S. marks the 37th anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court ruling that imposed abortion on America, and as the U.S. Congress deliberates legislation that could lead to dramatic increases in taxpayer funding for abortion, I see a time of great hope ... especially because pro-life advocates are willing to step out in faith and pray and fast for an end to abortion during this year's 40 Days for Life campaign."

Month-long observations include: American Heart Month, American History Month and Black History Month. Special days include: Groundhog Day, Ash Wednesday, Lent and Leap Day (2/29 only occurs once every four years, known as Leap Year). Of course, we chocolate lovers must include National Chocolate Cake Day on 2/27 and National Chocolate Day on 2/10.
