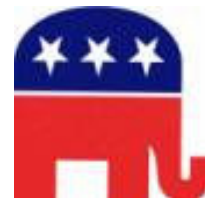

Legislative News



The Federal Communications Commission ruled on Thursday, October 22 to set up new rules and regulations for the Internet. INTERNET ACCESS RULES that will be enforceable by law. These rules will require an investment in advance (\$\$\$) and affect cable, wireless and telecom. (Net Neutrality.)

It would affect such companies as Verizon, AT&T and Comcast as well as other smaller companies and any other future businesses. But, this ruling specifically does not apply to Google.

The FCC Chairman is J. Genachowski, and he was President Obama's former technology advisor. Liberal Democrats now control the FCC. Key lawmaker's, such as Henry Waxman (D-CA) and Ed Markey (D-MA), have said that they will co-author a net neutrality bill. We know who these men are and they are always on the side of OBAMA!

Senator John McCain has introduced a bill called the INTERNET FREEDOM ACT of 2009 to block these new rules by the FCC from ever being put into effect.

The public has approximately 90 days for comment at an open forum and the liberals have already begun. You can, if you choose, comment at the Web site www.OpenInternet.gov.

In My Opinion ...

The day after the Primary Election, we read in the Fayetteville Observer in total amazement that "Only 5.5 percent of city's eligible voters cast ballots!" We then asked ourselves "What can we do when presented with such apathy from the masses?" For sure, we must not loose hope but continue to fight for our cause because only that, with prayer, will give us ultimate victory. With Election Day Tuesday, November right around the corner, there is work to be done and still much we can accomplish. We still wonder, though, "Why such apathy?" Various reasons heard: 1. The Primary Election received virtually no publicity. 2. Thus, many good people honestly forgot to vote. 3. This is an "Off-Year Election" and many don't deem it very important.

OK - so there are reasons. Now we ask, "What is an Off-Year Election?" Interestingly, two definitions for this were found: 1. In American politics, an Off-Year Election is generally considered to be the general elections held in odd-numbered years. These elections rarely feature any election to a national office, few state legislative elections and very few gubernatorial (governor) elections. In some cases there are actually no partisan races held, which is called a "blue moon election." The vast majority of these elections are held at the municipal level. On the ballot are many mayors, a wide variety of citizen initiatives in various states, and many more local public offices. 2. U.S. Representatives and one-third of the Senate are up for election every two years. An Off-Year Election is one that does not fall on a Presidential Election, which is every four years

In reality, the 2009 elections as well as the upcoming 2010 elections both fit these two descriptions, and both are actually extremely important. We must plant seeds now to reap the harvest we want later. As President Suzanne Rucker wrote in the last newsletter, "Changing government starts at the local level." It truly does and we have to do what we can to change wrong mindsets concerning this matter. There is still much we can do and it's never too late to make a difference. Locally, we have several Republicans running against incumbent Democrats. These include Republican **Bob White**, running for mayor of Fayetteville running against the Democrat incumbent; Republican **George Boggs**, running for Fayetteville City Council District 3 against incumbent Robert Massey; Republican **Wade Fowler**, running for Fayetteville City Council District 6 against incumbent Bill Crisp; and **Jackie Warner**, running against incumbent Hope Mills mayor Eddie Dees.

"A democracy cannot exist as a permanent form of government. It can only exist until the voters discover that they can vote themselves largess of the public treasury. From that time on the majority always votes for the candidates promising the most benefits from the public treasury, with the results that a democracy always collapses over loose fiscal policy, always followed by a dictatorship.

The average age of the world's great civilizations has been 200 years. These nations have progressed through this sequence: from bondage to spiritual faith; from spiritual faith to great courage; from courage to liberty; from liberty to abundance; from abundance to selfishness; from selfishness to complacency; from complacency to apathy; from apathy to dependency; from dependency back again to bondage."
